

Correct Application of Single Use Band Tourniquet


Tear one tourniquet from the roll at the perforation. Stretch the tourniquet and position the stretched tourniquet behind the arm, above the location where you wish to draw blood.




Keeping the tourniquet tightly stretched, tuck one side of the tourniquet under the other side - DO NOT TIE INTO A KNOT.




After the procedure has been completed, remove the tourniquet by pulling the tucked end upwards in a short rapid motion. This medical device and tie method has been designed to allow single hand release.



Keeping the tourniquet tightly stretched, to ensure sufficent compression, bring both sides across the arm and hold tightly where the two sides of the band meet.



Remove your finger. Ensure that the ends of the tourniquet are pointing upwards (in a 'Rabbit Ears' fashion) to avoid obstructing the needle.



Always 'tuck' the tourniquet Never 'tie' in a knot

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
